Sports Premium



The Government provide schools and academies with a Sports Premium to make additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport in order to benefit all pupils. The funding for our Academy for the academic year 2018/19 is based on the number of pupils in Years 1-6 and is approximately £20,980 (based on previous year's allocation).

At West Town Lane we pride ourselves in the PE and sporting opportunities we offer the children, where we aim for every child to participate in a sport or activity that they are able to sustain for life. We employ specific coaches for sports under our teaching budget and use the specific Sports Premium grant to enhance our provision in a number of ways.
