

Design a Party Game – Friday

WE MADE IT!

Well done for getting to the end of Year 4. It has been a bit of a tricky year but you have all done so well in these very strange times. To celebrate, we are going to have a party!

For our party, we are going to play some party games and we would like you to design one. Your task is to make up your own party game that we can all play.

You might need to think about the following questions:

- **What will your game be called?**
- **What resources will you need?**
- **How many people can play your game?**
- **How long will your game be?**
- **What will the rules be?**

Below is a list of party games that you may already know. They may help you with some ideas for your own game. It can be similar to these or completely made up if you want.

Why don't you play the game with someone at home to celebrate the end of the year!

- **Pass the Parcel** – always popular! If you have a larger group, break them up into 10s so that you have smaller circles to deal with and you are less likely to lose count when wrapping the parcels! Colour-code the last wrapper in a different paper so you know you are on the last one for each parcel.
- **Musical statues** – time to get the tunes ready! Make sure you have plenty of adults to help you check for wobbles.
- **Coloured Corners** – a great dice game. Have 6 coloured pieces of card stuck to corners and walls in the space, then get the children to choose a colour and stand by the card. Roll a large coloured dice and whatever colour it lands on, that group are out. This is a nice quick game to get them moving.
- **Tumbling Tower** – give each group (of 5/6) a set of wooden blocks or building bricks and see who can build the tallest (stable) tower.
- **Dance-Off** – time to show off your dance moves! Use an online dance tutorial such as Just Dance (check out the videos on the Internet) to have a dance-a-long. Adults get to join in too!
- **Balloon Race** – great team game. Line up the children in lines of 10. Each child at the front of the line gets a balloon which goes over their head to the person behind, who puts it between their legs to the person behind them. Carry on down the line through the legs then over the head until you get to the end. The last person brings it back and you start again. The winning line is the first to get all of their team back to their starting places.
